Are there prep sessions to help me get ready?

- Yes, we are hosting MTF Prep Sessions. Topics include resumes, networking, and conversation.

How should I dress?

- Firms expect professional attire, with at least business casual. Search online for advice on clothing. If you need fresh clothes that you can keep, visit the Career Center.

What should I bring?

- 25 copies of your resume and a notepad to take notes.

What's the format of the event?

- 40-50 tables spread around a large room to network, pick up information at tables, and learn about jobs.

How should I manage my time during the event?

- Visit at least 10 tables. You never know what connections you can make for opportunities!
- Spend about 5-10 minutes at a table. Introduce yourself, ask questions, and get contact information to send follow-up notes.

Do I need to show up at 1pm?

- No - in fact, you may get more facetime with employers in the second half.

I'm a freshman – is it too early for me to attend?

- Not at all. You can introduce yourself to many other companies and have a good conversation. This is excellent practice for networking and future opportunities.

I've already signed up for other events like Office Hours. Should I still attend?

- Yes! Recruiters would like to re-connect with students to discuss opportunities and this will help you prepare for what they are looking for and future interviews.
